The Work of the Pathways For Tomorrow Initiative Continues...

In 2022, HTS received a \$1 million five-year grant from The Lilly Endowment, Inc., to address critical challenges in preparing pastoral leaders for the future.

As the 2025-26 academic year begins, the PFT team remains focused on its four focus areas:

- · Expanding academic programs
- · Offering didactics on anti-racism and contested issues
- · Provide training in personal and organizational finance
- · Launch a Student Debt Reduction and Alumni Ambassador Program

The initial grant period concludes in 2027; therefore, HTS is launching two new centers as part of the program's long-term sustainability efforts. The Center for Financial Empowerment, led by Dr. Kevin Griffin, will focus on empowering clergy and churches to thrive through financial literacy education and practical tools. The Center for Justice, Love, and

Belonging, led by Dr. Karen Owens, will serve as a hub for community engagement and pastoral formation around social justice. These Centers, that align with the core values of HTS, will also carry forward the grant's mission and extend its impact well beyond its original timeline. Other members of the HTS PFT team include: Dr. Clay Barrow, Dr. Regina Dancy, and Rev. Thomas Grinter. Dr. John Everett and Dr. Obery Hendricks serve in advisory capacities.



The Institute for Rural & Small-Town Ministry & Leadership is excited to share with you what we've been doing.

We started accepting applications for Micro Grants in September and on September 30th we had a group of five people who are not with the Institute for Rural & Small-Town Ministry & Leadership meet on campus to review the grant applications and give feedback about the applications. This was very helpful to us because it gave us different perspectives on the requests. The reviewers were a good group of people and by the end of the day, they all seemed to be friends with each other. They had the opportunity to learn about our program, and they were impressed with the difference we are making in the community. Out of our five reviewers, two are planning to be coaches.

We were able to choose seventeen very deserving ministries to receive the micro grants. We're really excited to see the difference that these grants will make to the recipients.

We attended the Hood Theological Seminary symposium. The speakers and the activities were eye-opening and gave us great ideas about ways that we can improve our program. It's always great to hear what works well for other people to get ideas about things that may work for us.

We are thrilled to be making such progress, and we're excited to see what happens next.



Applications for The Center for Bold Leadership's Leadership Development Cohort are now being accepted. The Cohort begins on January 8, 2026, and runs through November.

The Cohort is open to African American female clergy in their 2nd through 9th year in pastoral ministry. This is a wonderful opportunity for early-career clergy to hone their leadership skills and focus on wholeness, wellness, and renewal. Coaches and Spiritual Directors will walk alongside Cohort members to provide guidance and help them build strong, sustainable, and successful ministries.

Celebrating the Life of Dr. William Lawrence New Testament Scholar, Theologian, and Dean

On behalf of the administration, staff, and faculty of Hood Theological Seminary, we give thanks for the life and legacy of Dr. William Lawrence, a profound New Testament scholar, dedicated professor, and former dean whose influence shaped generations of church leaders, scholars, pastors and bishops. His unwavering commitment to theological education and academic excellence will always be remembered with deep gratitude and admiration.

Dr. Lawrence brought to his teaching a rich understanding of the New Testament, equipping students not only with the tools of exegesis but also with an enduring appreciation for how scripture informs preaching and the proclamation of Christ. Through his guidance, countless students—many of whom would go on to become bishops—were challenged to examine their theology deeply and to ground their ministry in thoughtful, faithful interpretation of the Word.

As a professor of both New Testament and systematic theology, Dr. Lawrence left a lasting impression. His classes were spaces where students were not only educated but formed—spiritually, intellectually, and pastorally. He made himself available in ways that extended far beyond the classroom, offering a safe and trusted presence for students navigating the personal and often sensitive realities of ministry.

His legacy lives on in pulpits, classrooms, and communities where former students now serve. His memory is a continued invitation to preach the Gospel with integrity, to teach with clarity, and to live out one's calling with courage.

We honor Dr. William Lawrence with gratitude for a life that has richly blessed the church and the academy. May he rest in the peace of Christ whom he so faithfully served.
