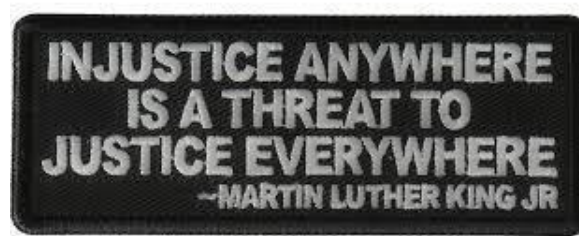

In These Stressful Times: A Reminder

Stress is a normal part of life, but when it becomes frequent or long-lasting, it can take a serious toll on both the body and the mind. Stress generally falls into three categories: acute stress, which is short-term and quickly passes; episodic acute stress, which occurs often and leaves little time to recover; and chronic stress, which persists for weeks, months, or longer. Veterans, first responders, and caregivers are especially vulnerable to the latter two due to repeated exposure to high-pressure situations.

Because stress activates the body's autonomic nervous system, ongoing negative stress can lead to a wide range of symptoms. These include fatigue, headaches, muscle tension, digestive issues, weakened immunity, anxiety, irritability, and depression. Over time, chronic stress can contribute to more serious health concerns such as high blood pressure, heart problems, arthritis, gastrointestinal disorders, weight changes, and reproductive health issues. Prolonged stress also increases the risk of developing mental health conditions like anxiety, depression, and substance use disorders.

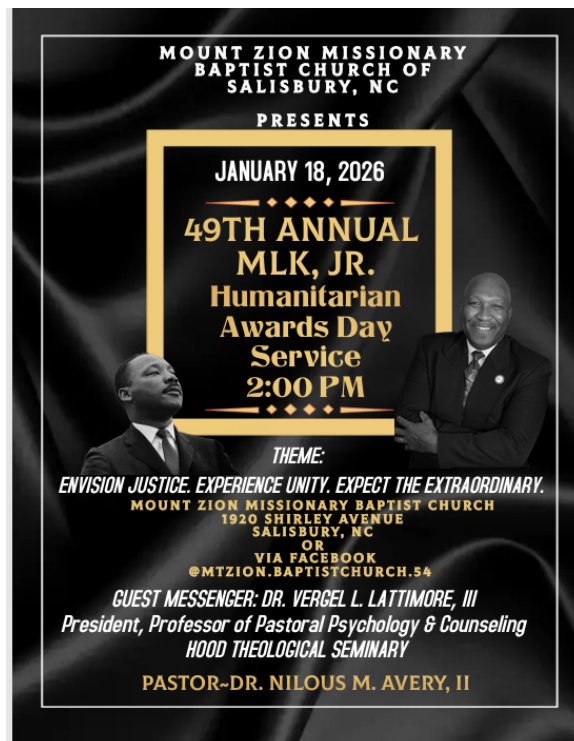
Recognizing stress early and addressing it with healthy coping strategies is essential for protecting overall well-being.

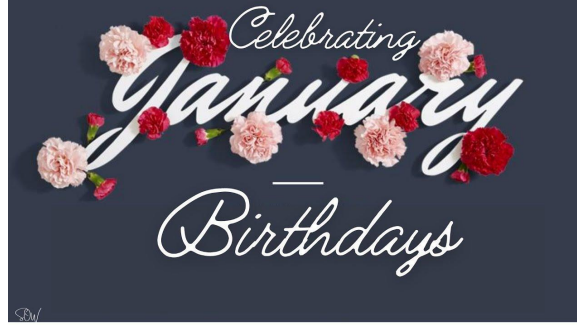
