

The Center for Chaplaincy

The Center for Chaplaincy at Hood Theological Seminary is established as a vehicle to foster awareness, information exchange, and collaboration about the opportunities and practices in the field of professional chaplaincy.

The Center for Chaplaincy will partner with chaplain practitioners from representative professional organizations to fulfill the following objectives:

- Educate students about the various types of chaplaincy
- Provide opportunities for professional chaplains to participate in continuing education programs and workshops
- Create and sponsor visitation opportunities for students to network with chaplain professionals
- Facilitate formal and informal student learning opportunities within selected chaplain organizations

Poverty Simulation

A Poverty Simulation is an exercise to raise awareness among community leaders about the challenges that low-income individuals and families face. Cooperative Christian Ministry provides Poverty Simulations for churches and community groups with a kit designed by Missouri's Community Action.

The Poverty Simulation experience is designed to help participants begin to understand what it might be like to live in a typical low-income family trying to survive from month to month. *It is a simulation, not a game*. The object is to sensitize participants to the realities faced by low-income people.

The experience lasts for 2 1/2 hours. It includes an introduction and briefing, the actual simulation exercise, and a debriefing period in which participants and volunteer staffers share their feelings and experiences and talk about what they have learned about the lives of people in poverty.
