

Fall 2024 Bishop Rueben L. Speaks Lecture Series


Hood Theological Seminary will hold its annual Ruben L. Speaks Endowed Memorial Lecture Series on Friday and Saturday, October 4 and 5, 2024. **This year's featured presenter is Bishop Gregory Vaughn Palmer**, who is the former (now retired) Presiding Prelate of the West Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church and, previously, the longest serving active UMC bishop.

AME Zion Bishop Darryl Starnes will be responding to Bishop Palmer's remarks about the most recent UMC General Conference and the future of the UMC.

The Ruben L. Speaks Endowed Memorial Lecture Series is named in honor of the late Bishop Ruben Lee Speaks, a gifted African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church leader acknowledged on numerous occasions for his leadership and creative engagement in ministry. Speaks received the Chancellor's Award from the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and the Distinguished Citizen Award from the Brooklyn Advisory Committee of the New York Urban League.

The lectures, which are free of charge and open to the public, will be held at 6:00 p.m. on Friday, October 4, and 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 5. CDF Child Advocacy Experience at Alex Haley's Farm

Hood had two students (LaTanya Pender and Frederick Cannady-Kelderman) to participate in the annual Dale Andrews Freedom Seminary and the Hall-Proctor Institute for Child Advocacy Ministry. This opportunity is sponsored by the Children's Defense Fund that brings together a broad spectrum of speakers and resources to address child/youth well-being. The gathering occurred at Alex Haley's Farm in Clinton, TN, July 15-18. This experience brings together seminary students from across the country to explore the ministry of child advocacy and to interact with experts in the field. The 2024 theme was "Unleashing the Joy." Cannady is grateful for the opportunity to return to the Haley Farm for a second time. Last year, Frederick made a commitment to himself that Haley Farm would serve two purposes: (1) as intentional time for self-care and rest, and (2) as continued motivation to engage in child advocacy work. By prioritizing the well-being of our younger generation, we can make lasting impacts not only on their lives but also on the lives of everyone with whom they interact. Professor Dora R Mbuwayesango attended a hybrid 6th Pan African Sankofa 2024 Conference of the The Circle of Concerned African Women Theologians that took place at Trinity Theological Seminary, Leon, Ghana, July 1-5. The theme of the conference was "Earth, Pandemics, Gender and Religion.





Dr. Mary Love attended the 52nd General Conference of the A. M. E. Zion Church held in Greensboro. She also prepared an 80-piece exhibit entitled, *The Journey from Africa through the Transatlantic Slave Trade, Slavery, the Underground Railroad, to obtaining Freedom with the ability to make contributions to America and the World that are honored on US Postage Stamps.*" On March 9, 2024, a series of 10 stamps were issued recognizing the role of the Underground Railroad in helping slaves escape to freedom. Of the 10 individuals honored, three were members of the A. M. E. Zion Church: Bishop Jermain Wesley Loguen, Harriet Tubman and Frederick Douglass. This exhibit was designed to remind viewers of the significant contributions of our ancestors and provide motivation to never give up even when facing terrible odds (see pictures below).





On July 27, Love also had the opportunity to participate in the Unveiling Ceremony of the Underground Railroad Stamps at CHARPEX (The Charlotte Philatelic Society) at Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) in Charlotte (see picture below).






Free Books in the Hood Library!
