
Upcoming Events

Fall 2024 Bishop Ruben L. Speaks Lecture Series

This year's featured presenter is Bishop Gregory Vaughn Palmer, who is the former (now retired) Presiding Prelate of the West Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church and, previously, the longest serving active UMC bishop.

Fall 2024 Messinger-Williams Family Community Education Initiative


