

The Association of Theological Schools (ATS) held its biennial meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, June 19-21. During the conference, selected schools who are recipients of *the Pathways For Tomorrow* grant funded by the Lilly Endowment, Inc., were invited to share learnings and inspire creative conversations regarding the work of innovation that is occurring in a few of the schools as outlined in their grant proposals.

Hood Theological Seminary was selected to present one focus area of its grant, *Creating Contested Issues/Anti-Racism Courses*, in which the first two six-week series occurred during the 2023-24 school year. Dr. Karen Owens, Director of Strategic Research/Project Director for *the Pathways For Tomorrow* grant, invited the first two presenters, Dr. Samuel Oliver, Jr., who presented on *Critical Race Theory and the Church*, and Dr. Obery Hendricks, who taught portions of his book, *The Politics of Jesus*, to join her at the expo. This was a great opportunity for Hood Theological Seminary to provide useful insight to other theological schools, to share its findings, present materials, inspire creativity, and to foster new and ongoing academic partnerships that enable reflection and conversation about these sensitive yet important topics for the Church and beyond, particularly, in this current polarized society.


